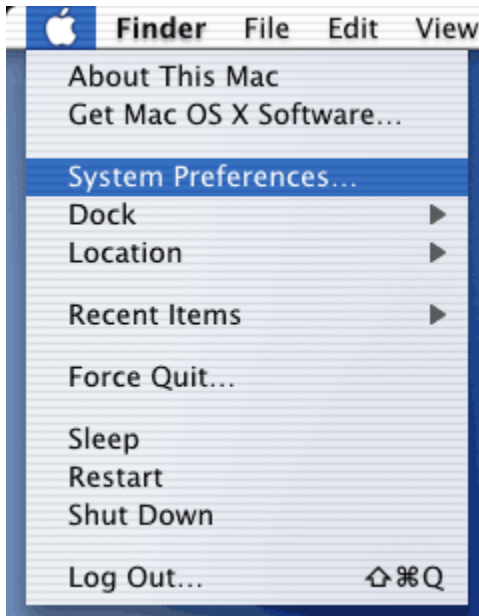

- You need to add or remove static IP addresses in Mac OS 10.x-10.2.

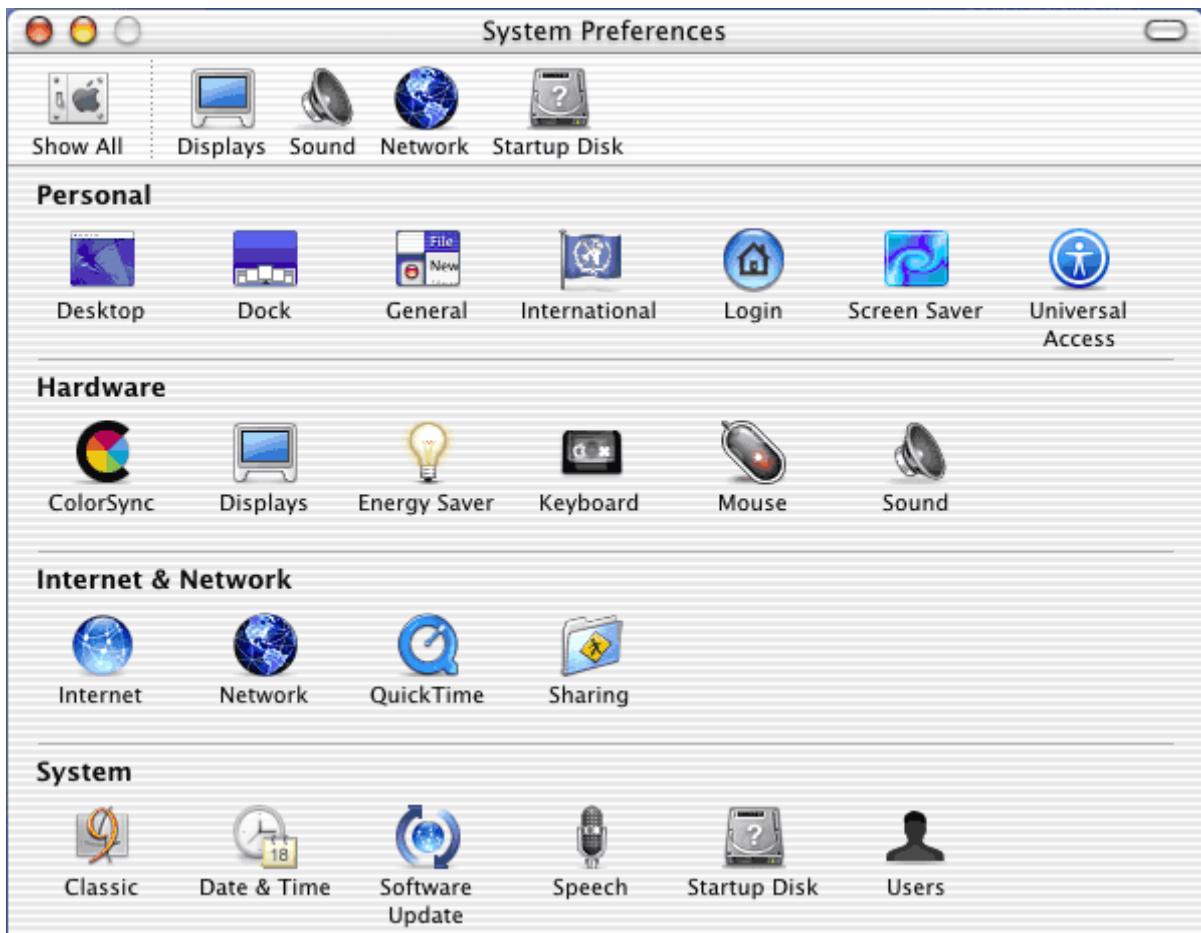
This document assumes:

- You have full Administrative rights on your computer.

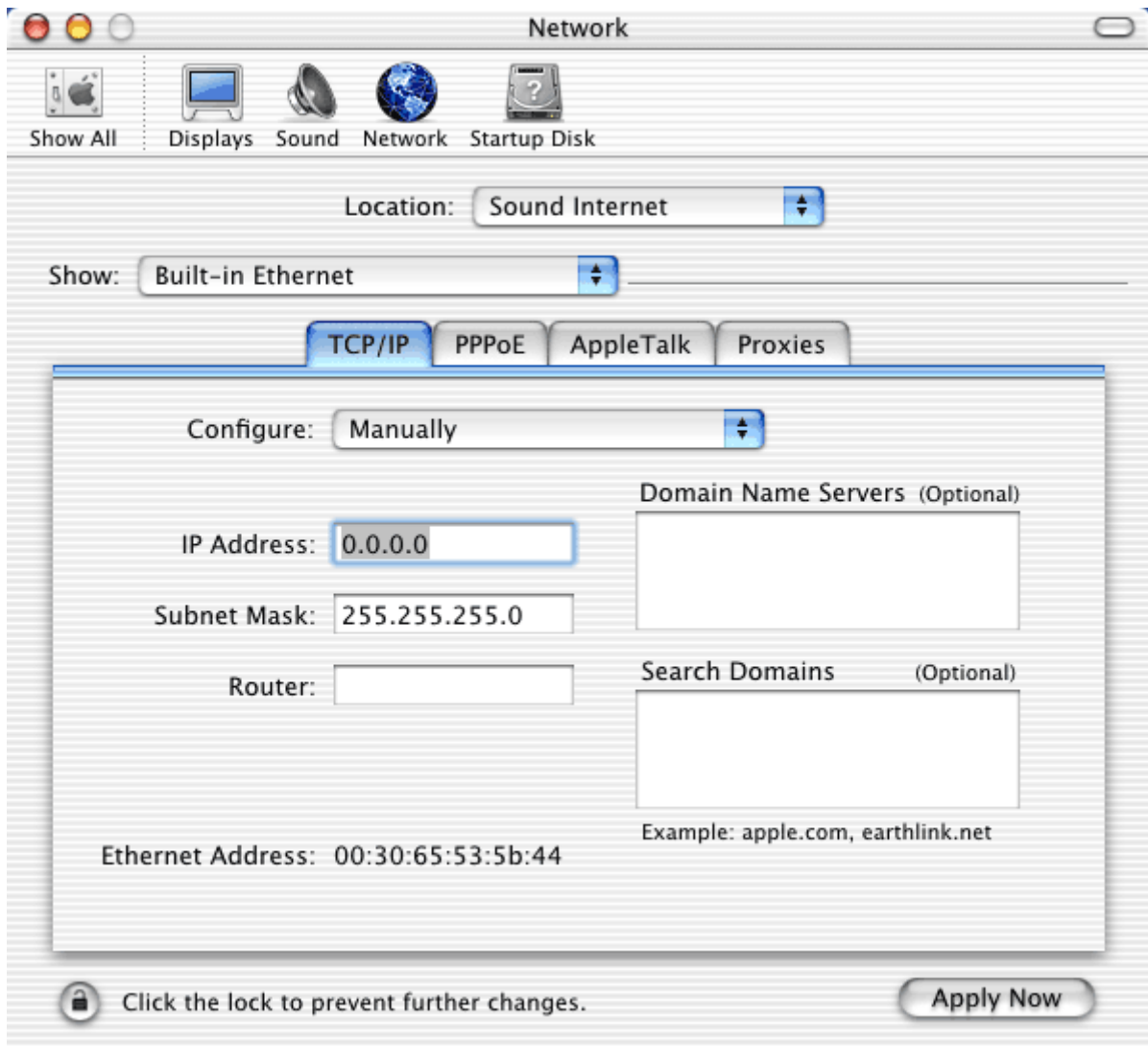
1. Select **System Preferences** from the Apple menu.



2. Select **Network**.



3. In the "Show" field, confirm that **Built-in Ethernet** is selected. Select the **TCP/IP** tab. For a Static IP address, select **Manually** in the "Configure" field. Type the **IP address**, **Subnet Mask** and **Router IP** (Gateway IP) in the corresponding fields. Type the first **DNS server IP** in the "Domain Name Servers" field. Select **Return**. Type the second **DNS server IP**.



4. After making your changes, select the **Apply Now** button. Then, select the **red circle** in the top left corner to exit.
